

ACCELERATED/HONORS PREP CURRICULUM

The Accelerated/Honors Prep Curriculum is a four-year course of study directed at the highly, academically gifted and talented students who enjoy the challenges of a demanding program of studies and the stimulation associated with friendly competition from their peers with similar interests, experiences and backgrounds. Students in the Accelerated/Honors Prep Curriculum move at a faster pace, cover more material and are exposed to a variety of supplementary materials and outside reading that parallels the basic text. In addition, each student must complete 60 hours of Christian Service over a four-year period to be eligible for graduation. Listed below are both the minimum and recommended graduation requirements for the students following the Accelerated/Honors Prep Curriculum (the Honors courses are designated by the letter "A/H" following the course title):

- .5 Performing Arts U
- 3.0 Electives
- 25.0 Minimum Credits

It is anticipated that the students in the Accelerated/Honors Prep Curriculum will enroll in all Advanced Placement courses, where available, their junior and senior years.

<u>UPPER COLLEGE PREP CURRICULUM</u>

The Upper College Prep Curriculum is a four-year course of study directed at providing students with a fundamental understanding of the basic skills and discipline they will need to achieve success in college. In addition, each student must complete 60 hours of Christian Service over a four-year period to be eligible for graduation. The following recommended minimum graduation requirements for the Upper College Prep Curriculum are available for all students who are capable of responding to the demands of this curriculum (the Upper College Prep courses are designated by the letters "U" following the course title):

- 4.0 credits in Theology U
- 4.0 credits in English U
- 3.0 credits in Math U
- 3.0 credits in Science U
- 3.0 credits in Social Studies U
- 2.0 credits in the SAME World Language U
- 1.0 credit in Physical Education U
- .5 credit in Computer Applications U
- .5 credit in Health U
- .5 credit in Visual Arts U
- .5 credit in Performing Arts U
- 3.0 Electives

THE COLLEGE PREP CURRICULUM

The College Prep Curriculum is a four-year course of study directed at providing students with the understanding of the basic skills in Reading, Math, Social Studies, and Science. The mastery of these skills will better prepare them for further academic studies. In addition, each student must complete 60 hours of Christian Service over a four-year period to be eligible for graduation. The following recommended minimum graduation requirements for the College Prep Curriculum are available for these students (the College Prep courses are designated by the letter "C" following the course title):

- 4.0 credits in Theology U
- 4.0 credits in English C
- 3.0 credits in Math C
- 3.0 credits in Science C
- 3.0 credits in Social Studies C
- 2.0 credits in Reading or in the Fine Arts IN LIEU OF WORLD LANGUAGE
- 1.0 credit in Physical Education U
- .5 credit in Computer Applications U
- .5 credit in Health U
- .5 credit in Visual Arts U
- .5 credit in Performing Arts- U
- 3.0 Electives
